The Easter Season

Have you noticed that many people today jump very quickly from one celebration or event to another without really savouring the experience and its meaning? It's kind of, "That's finished, what's next?" for many people as they rush from one thing to another.

In contrast, the church generously allows a whole season for our festivals. So instead of flipping over to something new, we will now ponder the impact of Jesus' resurrection from Easter until Pentecost. Over these weeks we read the book of Acts rather than from the Hebrew Scriptures and we observe the transformation of the disciples from being fear filled and confused about their roles into people confident with an assurance that came from the resurrection power they saw evidenced in Jesus. It's not just an intellectual acknowledgement of God's power but a huge difference in the way they followed Jesus, utterly believing in his power to renew and to heal.

These stories are powerful because we can also open our hearts to experience God in a more powerful way.

Missions

One of our major missions project is to support R in Indonesia. He has changed his role this year from mentoring several pastors to becoming the rector of a large parish. **Institution and Induction Service** of R as the Vicar of All Saints Anglican Church Jakarta was conducted by the Bishop of Singapore Archbishop Tutus Chung and the Dean of Indonesia. The day before the Induction Service, eleven young people and adults from All Saints Anglican Church were confirmed in a bilingual service (Indonesian and English) along with 45 other young people and adults from the five other local Anglican churches. It is just twelve months since the previous confirmation service here in Jakarta, so it was encouraging to see so many people coming forward to be confirmed.

We are asked to pray that God would raise up a person to serve as an intern for twelve months to assist with Sunday services as well as the youth and young adult ministries.



Revd Kathy has taken on the role of Safe Ministry Officer, which is a complex one- and many parishes have others to help with the workload. If this interests you, there's a workshop coming up with members of the Kooyoora team are hoping to meet clergy and SMOs to talk through what Kooyoora does and how Kooyoora can assist in the work being done in parishes. Topics to be included – clearances, reporting a complaint, persons of concern.
